

Princeton Internship Programs

Program name: Andlinger Center for Energy and the Environment (ACEE) Summer Internships

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: Priority deadline: Feb. 17, 2017, Regular deadline: March 10, 2017

Description: Research related to ACEE's mission of providing solutions to ensure our energy and environmental future.

Program name: Career Services - Princeternship Program (Externship during winter and/or spring recess)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors, Grad students (spring recess session only)

Length: 1-5 days for the winter session; 1 day for the spring session

Application deadline: 11/8/16 for winter session; TBD for spring session

Description: Experience a "day in the life" of a particular workplace with an alum as your guide. Opportunities span a range of geographic regions, industries and fields, and can be a vital part of career development. Reading Period/intersession will be one-on-one visits with alumni. Spring recess sessions will be large-group site visits.

Program name: Community Based Learning Initiative (CBLI) Derian Internship

For: Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 9 weeks

Application deadline: 2/14/2017

Description: Working with local nonprofits, students develop research projects, collect and analyze data, and share their results and conclusions, not just with their professors, but also with organizations and agencies that can make use of the information. Working with CBLI, students can do community-based research in courses, as a summer research internship, and as part of their junior paper or senior thesis.

Program name: German Summer Work Program

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 4-10 weeks

Application deadline: November 2016

Description: Students are matched with internships with leading German companies and institutions in industries, including banking, marketing, arts, government, healthcare and law. Most internships require a B- grade in GER 107 or equivalent German language proficiency.

Program name: Health Grand Challenge internships

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: 12/11/16

Description: Fully-funded summer internships in the U.S. and/or abroad.

Program name: International Internship Program - (IIP)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: 12/5/16 online; 12/7/16 paper in person

Description: Fully-funded, summer internships in many interest areas in over 60 countries.

Program name: International Internships Program - Princeton in France

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: 12/5/16 online; 12/7/16 paper in person

Description: Summer internships in France that focus on providing an introduction to French culture and society.

Program name: International Internships Program - Student Initiated Internships - (SII)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: Spring 2017

Description: Support for summer international internships.

Program name: International Internships Program - Global Seminar Internships - (IIP-GS)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 4 weeks

Application deadline: Spring 2017

Description: For students already accepted into a Global Seminar. These experiences provide an initial introduction to a foreign work environment.

Program name: Keller Center - Princeton Start-Up Immersion Program (PSIP- NYC)

For: Freshmen (limited availability), Juniors, Sophomores and Graduate students

Application deadline: 12/2/16

Description: For those interested in working at an early-stage start-up in NYC. Application includes completion of a "challenge" puzzle. Housing provided, expense stipend available.

Program name: Keller Center - Princeton Start-Up Immersion Program in Israel (PSIP- Israel)

For: Sophomores, Juniors, Graduate students

Length: 10 weeks

Application deadline: 12/2/16

Description: Internship and academic and cultural enrichment programs, with the chance to discover the “secret sauce” behind Israel's successful startup culture. Entrepreneurial opportunities in high tech, social ventures, biotech, environmental sectors. Application includes completion of a "challenge" puzzle. Housing provided, flight and expense stipend available.

Program name: Keller Center - REACH (International Exchange Research Program)

For: Engineering students

Length: 8 weeks

Application deadline: 12/15/16

Description: Opportunities in Hong Kong, Germany and Taiwan for eight-weeks, hands-on research internship in an international context. Participating students will be immersed in a new culture while working on a research project in their field of study. The program aims to broaden students' perspectives and enable them to become globally minded researchers and technologists. At least 13 Princeton engineering students (excluding seniors) will be abroad to participate in this program and in exchange, Princeton will host international engineering students at Princeton during the summer.

Program name: Keller Center - Tiger Challenge

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors

Length: Year-round; 10 weeks in the summer

Application deadline: 10/28/16 (Academic Year Challenge); 3/1/2017 (Summer)

Description: Multi-disciplinary teams of students tackle complex and important challenges using "design thinking" to build impactful innovations. For example, a team is currently working with the Mayor's office of Princeton, NJ, to redesign the affordable housing application process.

Program name: Office of International Program – Streicker International Fellows Fund

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: Early Action 1/8/17 / Regular Decision: 2/12/17

Description: SIFF was established in early 2015 by John H. Streicker '64 to provide undergraduate students the opportunity to carry out substantive research or educational projects while immersed in a foreign culture. Fellows design their own projects or internships in conjunction with a hosting organization, in any academic or professional area, and in any geographic region outside of the U.S. These projects or internships provide students with opportunities for intellectual and personal growth through a combination of work or research and immersion in a foreign culture. Up to ten students are accepted and awards typically range between \$4,000 and \$6,000.

Program name: Office of Undergraduate Research - ReMatch Summer Undergraduate Research Program (R-SURP)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores

Length: 9 weeks

Application deadline: 2/27/17

Description: A research-mentoring program designed to connect undergraduate students and graduate students. The program provides an opportunity to carry out a paid graduate-mentored research project over the summer.

Program name: Office of Undergraduate Research – Student Initiated Internships (OURSIP)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: Spring 2017

Description: OURSIP provides a limited number of grants to Princeton freshmen, sophomores, and juniors who have independently created or secured unpaid faculty-mentored research internships for a minimum of 8 weeks during the summer.

Program name: Pace Center - Guggenheim Internships in Criminal Justice

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 8-10 weeks

Application deadline: February 3, 2017

Description: For students to develop a real-world understanding of legal issues in criminal justice, to learn about policy innovations and to consider future careers or further education in fields related to criminal justice.

Program name: Pace Center - John C. Bogle '51 Fellows in Civic Service (Internship)

For: Freshmen

Length: Year-long (Spring 2017 through Fall 2017)

Application deadline: February 12, 2017

Description: Developed to support participation in service or civic engagement during the summer between freshman and sophomore year. In this year-long program, fellows develop their own service or civic engagement-related project or internship during the spring semester, immerse themselves in it over the summer and connect it back to their academic learning and career interests during the fall of sophomore year. Projects/internships, which must take place in the U.S., can address service or civic-related issues in any area including government, education, the arts, the sciences or business through a variety of methods such as entrepreneurship, policy, advocacy, research, direct service, and community activism. Fellows receive a stipend.

Program name: Princeton Environmental Institute (PEI) Internship Program

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 8-12 weeks

Application deadline: 01/13/2017 priority deadline; 03/29/2017 final deadline

Description: Mentored assignments with Princeton faculty and other qualified hosts. Focus is on global environmental issues including climate science, energy alternatives, water, health, biodiversity, conservation, ocean biogeochemistry and sustainability. Many involve field research, including international destinations.

Program name: Princeton Environmental Institute (PEI) Student-Initiated Internships

For: Sophomores, Juniors

Length: Minimum of 8 weeks

Application deadline: 3/3/17

Description: Funding to support mentored projects with an environmental focus. To qualify, applicants must have held a PEI established internship or similarly rigorous experience previously.

Program name: Princeton in Asia

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 8 weeks

Application deadline: December 2, 2016

Description: In addition to post-grad yearlong fellowships, PiA offers summer internship opportunities in the fields of education, journalism, and international development (NGOs).

Program name: Princeton Internships in Civic Services (PICS)

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors

Length: 8-10 weeks

Application deadline: 12/7/16

Description: Paid opportunities to explore careers in public service and the non-profit sector with alumni as partners. The internships encompass a wide range of endeavors in national and international organizations, working in group advocacy, legal services, public policy, the environment, health and social services, community development, education, and the arts.

Program name: Woodrow Wilson - Scholars in the Nation's Service (SINSI) Internship

For: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors who have interest in being a SINSI scholar

Length: 8-10 weeks

Application deadline: 10/21/16

Description: Through the generosity of donors, SINSI is able to offer funding for summer internships with the federal government to provide students with direct experience in public service, either domestically or abroad. Must be a U.S. citizen, have identified an area of US government work that is of particular interest and be able to successfully complete a background investigation and meet security and other requirements for work in the federal government.
